GORDON REECE



Gordon has kindly agreed to again become a Parish Councillor after previously serving Scriven more than a decade ago. Living in a 17 century timber structured building, Home Farm, on The Green he is particularly interested in conservation and preservation matters.

Gordon is well travelled and was a very successful businessman before his retirement. It is fair to say that Gordon adds a very important perspective to living in our Ancient Village setting and being the custodian of a Listed Building.

JACOB SMITH PARK

As residents will know JSP falls within the Parish of Scriven and it has a very active Friends of JSP group. They are to be greatly commended that after 4 years of lobbying to have secured a rustic type seat close to the Park entrance off Scriven Road.

This long outstanding facility has been requested by a number of residents who like to walk to the Park and then rest before they tackle the actual park walk and visit the newly developed wildlife pond. It is essential that the park remains a 'wild green area' for all local residents to use and not just dog walkers.



NEW ROUNDABOUT

There are many local residents within the Knaresborough area who believe the bland new roundabout at the entrance to The Pastures and Bar Lane does not reflect the image or the environmental features of Knaresborough and Scriven. It is simply a black mass of tarmac and stone bricks which allegedly cost over £1m.

Your local Parish, District and County Councillors are working together to improve



the situation. Collectively they are hopeful that a series of large plant containers will be located on the inner section of the roundabout. However, funding will have to come from the new developments. This will be a test of 4 Councils collectively working together whilst using Developers payment monies.
